CHILDREN'S AREA & KIDS' CRAFTS

Located directly west of the 90.1 FM KUER Main Stage Presented by United Concerts, the hours are the same as CLC festival hours. Please do not leave children unattended in the children's area.

FIRST AID

Located behind the 90.1 FM KUER Main Stage Presented by United Concerts.

LOST AND FOUND

Located in the CLC Info Booth (#26), just southwest of the 90.1 FM KUER Stage Presented by United Concerts, behind the waterfall.

PARKING

Full-day parking is offered for \$5 in the Utah One/Gallivan/Marriott parking lot accessed along 200 South. Parking is also available at the Walker Building, on the north side of 200 South across from the Gallivan Center for \$3. Metered parking Downtown is free for two hours on Saturday.

BIKE VALET

Provided by the Salt Lake City Bicycle Collective, the bike valet entrance is next to the Wells Fargo building, easily accessible from 300 South. Patrons are encouraged to donate for their complimentary service. Bike valet closes promptly at 10 p.m. both days of the festival.

CRAFT LAKE CITY'S SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY BUILDING

DIY ENGINEERS

Last year, we expanded the definition of the word "craft" by launching a new category for the Craft Lake City DIY Festival—DIY Engineers. Exhibitors in this category will present and vend items that they made by hand using science and technology tools.

This year's highlights include circuit-bending, robotics, futuristic amplifiers, LED fiberoptic art, 3D printing, gaming, computer animation, free classes taught by EnjiGo, stomp rockets, mini-light sabers and much more. Participating companies include GoEngineer, The Leonardo, SpyHop and Explore Utah Science. Below are details on two exciting Science & Technology events (both new this year!) that Craft Lake City is happy to present.


SATURDAY'S SUMO BOT COMPETITION 12 P.M.-4 P.M.

This competition, run by Michael Anderson of EnjiGo and Robot Fanatics, with help from Peter Reed, will take place on Saturday from 12–4 p.m. with winners and prizes announced shortly thereafter. The crew of the Geek Show Podcast, one of Utah's longestrunning podcasts on movies, pop culture and more, will judge the competition. Geek Show

Poscast Panelists Kerry Jackson, Shannon Barnson, Jimmy Martin, Jav Whittaker and Jeff Vice will be on hand to announce and add color commentary to the festivities as minibots compete to prove their superiority over all other bots! Size and weight restrictions apply. giving builders and experimenters a chance to show off their creative skills and an opportunity to overcome mechanical restrictions and challenges. Most bots will "autonomously" run into the ring with the objective of pushing each other out of the ring. The panel will also honor select bots and their makers with specialty awards throughout the day.

3D PRINTED ROBOT LED NECKLACES

Craft Lake City attendees can become DIY Engineers themselves by creating electronic craftworks at this year's festival. This interactive science and technology craft will be held at the Craft Lake City Information Booth (#26, just southwest of the 90.1 FM KUER Stage), and will consist of making a robot necklace with glowing LED eyes. GoEngineer has printed an army of 3D robot charms, and for a small fee, visitors can learn how to solder LED lights to the robot charms so their eves light up. A string will then be attached to the robots and participants will be able to take home their very own robot accessory, preserving memories of their en"light"ening day at Craft Lake City DIY Festival 2013 for years to come!





CELEBRATION OF THE HAND

July 2013 marks a fruitful one-year partnership between Craft Lake City and Salt Lake City nonprofits The Center For The Living City and The Temporary Museum of Permanent Change. Together, our goal is to beautify, enrich and enliven downtown Salt Lake City spaces through a walkable outdoor gallery titled Celebration of the Hand. During this year's festival, seven Craft Lake City artisans will be exhibiting giant-sized, mural-like original art-9 feet by 4 feet-on "plakats" (the German word for billboard). These plakats, permanent steel frames installed adjacent to the sidewalks in downtown Salt Lake City, are located on the North and South sides of Broadway (300 South) between 200 West and 200 East. The Celebration of the Hand exhibit is located just outside Craft Lake City DIY Festival boundaries and will be available for viewing during the festival on Aug. 9-10, and throughout September 2013.


