





July 2014 marks two years since Craft Lake City began its partnership with Steven Goldsmith and the Temporay Museum of Permanent Change.

Together, our goal is to beautify, enrich and enliven downtown Salt Lake City spaces through a walkable outdoor gallery titled *Celebration of the Hand*, which utilizes permanent steel frames known as "plakats" (the German word for billboard).

The plakats are installed adjacent to the sidewalks in downtown Salt Lake City, and are located on the North and South sides of Broadway (300 South) between 200 West and 200 East and on cityside streets.

This summer, the plakats feature upcycled artwork created by Craft Lake City volunteers, Kristin Baird, Janet Lee and Craft Lake City Development Coordinator Rachel Hayes. 
